

Educator to Bid Adieu to Alameda

ALAMEDA, Jan. 8. -Following her divorce suit against her husband, Thomas Speddy, and her subsequent resignation from the board of education, Mrs. H. Theresa Speddy, for some years one of the most active political leaders in Alameda, is to leave shortly for Cleveland, Ohio, where she is to return to her old work of teaching school. This was learned today when Mrs. Speddy returned from Tranquility, in the San Joaquin Valley, where she has been living since her resignation from the school board.

Mrs. Speddy, as a member of the board of education attracted considerable attention by starting several innovations in the Alameda school system. Her divorce came as a sensation in local society, and shortly thereafter she gave up her position on the board of education, retiring from politics and leaving Alameda.

She will be accompanied East by her son, Kenyon. Her daughter, Miss Faith Speddy, will remain here to finish her course at the University of California.

Mrs. Speddy was well known during the California suffrage campaign, when she was a leader in that work, and was prominent in many local civic organizations.
